



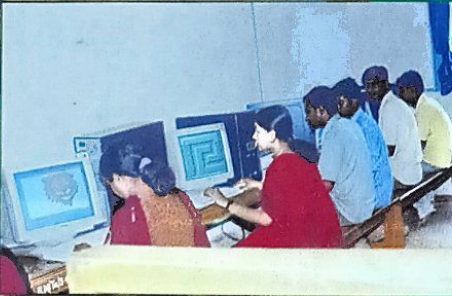

Brief Profile of the College

Bhargar Mahavidyalaya was established as a general Degree College in 1997 in a predominantly Muslim inhabited and agrarian backward area adjacent to the Bhargar Police Station, about 25 Kms. from the Science City (Kolkata). It is the only Institution of higher learning within the wide periphery of Bhargar, Haroa, Minakhan, Northern neighbours are Sushil Kar College and Sonarpur College, Rajarhat (Derozio), Barasat, Basirhat & Kalinagar College are in the north and Kolkata Colleges in the West-all are outside the distance of at least 28 Kms. Although a good number of Higher Secondary Schools surround the locality for quite sometime (one of them since way back in 1914), the aspirations of the local intelligentsia for having a Degree-level college went unfulfilled for a longtime. Ultimately, the overwhelming masses of the locality came forward in large numbers with whatever assets they might have had-be it money or materials or even labour and the leadership was provided by a team of dedicated political activists and social workers headed by A. R. Molla, Hon'ble Minister, Govt. of West Bengal, Bhargar-1 Panchayat Samity and Shri Ajoy Chakraborti, Local MP, joined in

the race for raising funds. Thus Bhargar Mahavidyalaya saw the light of the day. The college got affiliated to the University of Calcutta to impart teaching in-Arts (English, Bengali, History, Political Science, Education, Philosophy), Social Science (Economics, Geography and Mathematics) and Commerce (Accountancy Group)-faculties of undergraduate studies. The college has just completed the eighth year of its fruitful existence. While honours teaching in Geography had already been introduced, w.e.f. the academic session 2001-2002, the same in Bengali was introduced w.e.f. the academic session [2002-2003], Political Science and History (Hons) were introduced in 2004-05. In this year English and Education (Hons) are being introduced. Plans are a foot to extend Honours teaching facilities in other subjects in coming years. Special mention may be made about the academic environment of this locality within the minority (Muslim) community. Bereft of any opportunity to undertake higher education till the establishment of this college, a large body of Muslim students (at least 50% of the total Intake of the college), specially girl students (at least 50% of students are admitted from the community) had a fight within and outside to pave the way for social transformation; in venturing to take up this challenge in an area where an overwhelming majority of the students from all sections have been engaged as the first generation entity in the domain of higher education.

GOALS

Education is the manifestation of the soul. The college is situated primarily in a rural area. The aim of the institution is to reach out to the economically challenged students belonging to the minority communities and those still backward in thought as well as in expression. This is done ultimately with the hope of spreading the light of knowledge and wisdom around. Education as we know comes from the Greek word 'edu' and 'care' which means to bring out the latent faculty in the individual. Our goal is to participate in the process of bringing out the best in our students and contribute in our students and contribute to the growth of the locality.

OBJECTIVES

Education is about awareness and all round development of the mind and body. Cultural activities, sports activities, NCC and NSS programmes as well as multi-gym facilities all go to create an all round development of the personality of the students.



Compulsory computer literacy programme of the college aims to make students more information savvy and help them to get a more firm foothold in today's highly competitive world.

Awareness Camps, Introduction of vocational courses, training courses in (in the pipeline) the college are expected to help the students of the institution to seek a better foothold in the job field.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

1) Admission is made strictly on the basis of merit and reservations to various courses are made in keeping in with the Government Rules. Applications for admission to Degree Courses have to be made on the prescribed forms that is to be had from the college office by the dates fixed for the purpose. Forms will be issued on production of the original mark-sheet of the last qualifying public examination on the result of which admission is made. At the next stage, the admission form duly filled in and accompanied with necessary certificates and copies of Mark-sheet etc. has to be submitted and prescribed fees have to be paid to the office fixed for the purpose. The following documents in original are to be presented at the time of admission :

- Mark-sheet and certificate of the last qualifying Public Examination.
- Admit card of the Madhyamik/H.S. or other equivalent examinations where date of birth is mentioned.
- Passport size photo.

ACADEMIC SESSION AND VACATIONS/ RECESSES

The academic session commences from July every year and ends in the next June. The Vacations/Recesses are as follows :

1. Summer Recess : Normally, from 16th May to 30th June.
2. Autumn Vacation: Normally from the Sasthi of the Durga Puja to Bhatri Dwitiya.
3. Winter Recess : Normally from 25th to 31st December.

CLASS ATTENDANCE

As per regulations of the Calcutta University, a student must attend at least 75% of the classes actually held during each session to be eligible to appear at the University Examination as a regular candidate. If the attendance of the student remains less than 75% but not less than 60% of the total number of classes actually held in one or more subjects, he may, however, be allowed to appear at the University examinations as a non-collegiate at the discretion of the authorities concerned.



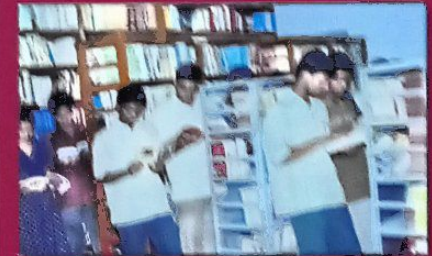

EXAM SYSTEM

The two-year tenure of Part I (Hons. and Gen.) has been divided into 4 semesters of 6 months each, at the end of such semesters will be a term end exam and the 4th or the last of it will be the test or sent up examinations. Part II students will appear for the test or sent up examination at the end of their term.

LIBRARY & READING ROOM

The College Library along with reading room facility is at present accommodated in a 1350 sq. ft. area. It is not yet fully equipped with optimum collection of books. Nevertheless, continuous efforts are being initiated to increase the number of titles as well as that of copies of such titles (both Text Books and Reference Books) as early as possible. Recently, a good number of copies had been added with the help of the UGC fund in the library. The library is in the process of being computerised.

The Library Sub-Committee looks after the proper functioning of the Library.

On production of the College Fee Book, a student can receive his/her Library card from the Library.

Borrowers are responsible for the book(s) issued to them for home facility. In case of any damage or loss of any books issued to them, it will have to be replaced at his/her expense.

SPORTS ACTIVITIES

Elaborate arrangements exist for both indoor and outdoor games and sports. The institution, being a co-educational one, there are both Girls' and Boys' Common Rooms equipped with facilities of indoor games.

The Annual Sports events are held every year in the college at which a large number of teachers, non-teaching staff and students participate, thereby fostering the spirit of co-operative living. Football, Cricket and Carom are some of the most popular games encouraged among the students. The college is in possession of a vast playground with beautiful landscape all around which makes a host of outdoor games feasible. The College participates in most of the games, sports and tournaments organised as Inter-Non-Govt. College meet by the Directorate of Sports, Govt. of West Bengal.

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STUDENTS' UNION

The Students' Union, an elected body is an important segment of the College, committed to students' welfare and maintaining a healthy atmosphere in the College; representatives from different classes and office-bearers of the Union are elected annually by the general body of the students through secret ballot. The activities of the Union include holding of fresher's welcome, annual cultural function, debates, publication of magazine, sports etc. The Students' Union is also closely associated with the administrative activities of the College, run according to democratic norms. The Students' Union has its own constitution approved by the College Governing Body.

MULTI GYM - CUM - FITNESS CENTRE

1) A fully equipped Multi Gym is all set to become functional within the premises of Bhangar Mahavidyalaya. The centre is open to students of the college, members of the alumni association and youths from the locality -all at a nominal fees.

COLLEGE MAGAZINES

The college publishes an annual wall magazine, named PDAKSHEP. It contains a rich collection of poems, short stories, articles contributed by teachers and students alike. The Students' Union plays a big role in seeing through its publication. With success of wall magazines as well as the first edition of the college magazine 'SRISHTI' the college had gone ahead to come out with its second edition of the college magazine.

Departmental wall magazines exist other than the annual edition of the college magazine. There are the departmental wall magazines that had been brought out by the dept. of Geography, Bengali English, Political Science, Economics, History, Education, Philosophy and Commerce. Other departments are expected to follow suit soon.

STUDENTS' HEALTH HOME

All bonafide students of the College are members of the Students' Health Home on the basis of universal membership. A nominal amount is collected from every student as membership fee at the time of commencement of each session.

CANTEEN

The College authorities are seriously thinking of opening a cheap canteen for the benefit of the students. Food, snacks and tea are to be made available from the canteen at low rates, once it gets going. The facility will be soon available.

ACADEMIC CALENDAR

The institution maintains an academic calendar prepared by the departments concerned in each term. This will be provided in a form of a booklet to the students at the time of admission.

STUDENTS' AID FUND

The College has always endeavoured to make its education service available to students coming from low income group of families by giving generous concessions and monetary help to them in consideration of their merit and pecuniary conditions. The Aid Fund Committee is entrusted with the task of selecting deserving candidates and disbursement of money under the direct authority of the Principal. Every student has to contribute an amount of Rs. 20.00 (Twenty) each session to the Aid Fund.

CONCESSIONS

The college does arrange for 'CONCESSIONS', for the students. Some of the available types of concessions are

a) Project officer cum District Welfare officer, Dept. of Backward classes welfare, Govt. of W.B.

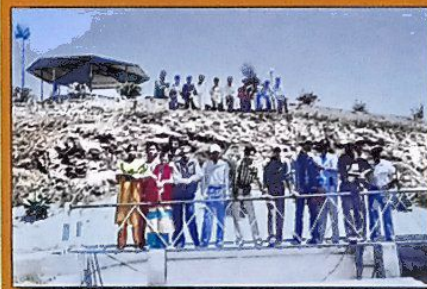
b) Mohasin Fund Fixed Endowment

ALUMNI ASSOCIATION

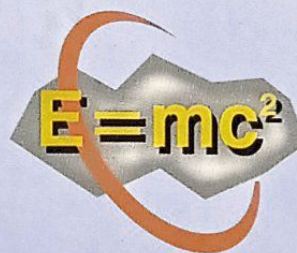

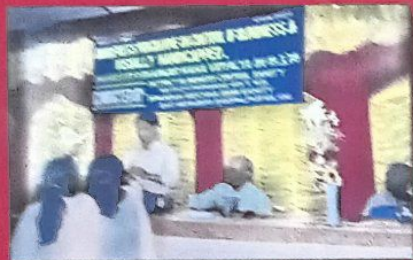
LABORATORIES

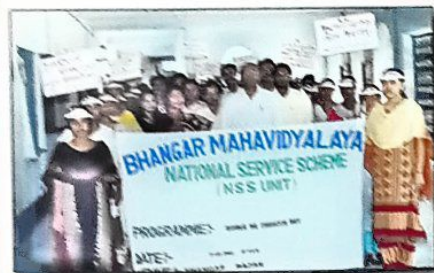

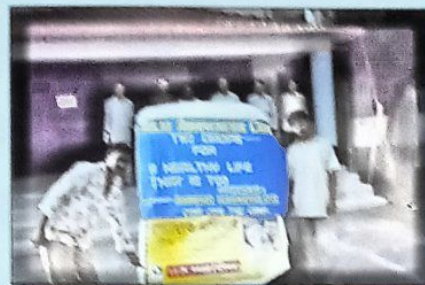

REGISTRATION AND MIGRATION CERTIFICATE

Regular candidates are required to take initiative to obtain University Registration Certificate. Students who come from other Universities or Education Boards / Council are provisionally admitted on production of the migration certificate from such University/Board/Council. After provisional admission, they need to apply through the Principal within one month from the date of admission to the Calcutta University with the requisite Migration Certificate to get his /her admission confirmed.

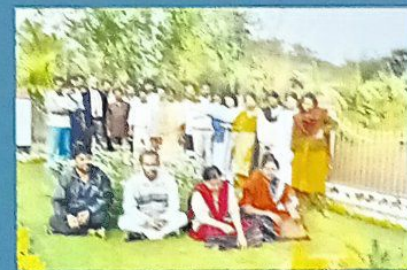
The college will not be responsible if the University does not sanction migration to such candidates and in such cases provisional admission may be cancelled.

Registration forms are required to be filled up after admission. The college will not be responsible for the registration of those students who take transfer from the college.

DISCIPLINE

It is mandatory to maintain strict discipline in the classes as also in the college premises. Students should not loiter or indulge in noisy and disorderly conduct in the college-yard, corridors or play ground. Students are required to appear at the examinations held by the college. Performance in the examinations and attendance in the classes are the criteria for promotion to the higher classes.

Sincere endeavours are made by the college authorities to mitigate all problems or difficulties of the students. The college offers an excellent opportunity to the students for personal contacts with the teachers for their academic help and guidance, a hallmark of the college.
