



### Brief Profile of the College

- Bhangar Mahavidyalaya is a Degree College of general higher education, situated in Bhangar I Block, Bhangar P. S., Baruipur Sub-Division under South 24 Parganas District, West Bengal. Excepting Sushilkar College (27 Kms.), Sonarpur Mahavidyalaya (30 Kms.) and Baruipur College (39 Kms.) in its South West, Barasat College (40 Kms.) and Derozio Memorial College (23 Kms.) in North-West, Basirhat College (52 Kms.) and Taki Govt. College (68 Kms.) in the North-East, Kalinagar College (80 Kms.) and Hazi Desaret College (90 Kms.) in the South-East, Bankim Sardar College (50 Kms.) in the South, and Kolkata College (at 30 Kms.) in the West there are Humayun Kabir Mahavidyalaya, Jibantala Rokeya Mahavidyalaya and there are no other Institutions Colleges. The vast area had been deprived of any institution of higher learning for a long time. Economic hardship and medieval communication link compelled the students belonging to ordinary and low middle class families to forsake prosecution of higher studies after passing from School Leaving Examinations. Only the few hailing from the rich and the upper middle class families could afford to seek admission in Kolkata and other advanced neighbouring areas at premiums, leaving the rest under-privileged, especially the girls students, stranded in the middle. The establishment of Bhangar Mahavidyalaya somewhat succeeded in filling in the vacuum in the sense that the vast multitude of young learners now got the change to stake their academic careers through this College by venturing either on foot or by cycle or by bus, trekker etc. In course of. time the road network has intersected Bhangar between the Science City (Kolkata) through the high profile Kolkata Leather Complex and Basanti, Dhamakhali, Kanmari and Mahancha in the East, Champahati, Sonarpur and Baruipur in the South-West, and with Rajarhat New Town in the North.
- The College owes its existence to a local Non-Government Organisation (Bhangar Unnayanee) where the leadership was provided by Abdur Rezzak Molla, the illustrious political personality of the area, for establishing a Degree College in Bhangar. The initiative ceremonially started in 1995 and the foundation stone was laid in 1996. The land was donated by the Irrigation Department, Government of West Bengal through Bhangar-1 Panchayat Samity. While the South 24 Parganas Zilla Parishad and the local M. P. Shri Ajoy Chakraborti extended financial assistance to the tune of Rs. 21 Lakhs (Rupees Twenty One Lakhs), the overwhelming masses of the locality came forward in large numbers with whatever assets they might have had-be it money or materials or even free labour-in fulfilling the long-cherished dream of having a Degree College of their own on their soil.
- Thus Bhangar Mahavidyalaya saw the light of the day. The college got affiliated to the University of Calcutta to impart teaching in Arts (English, Bengali, History Arabic), Political Science, Education, Philososphy, Social Science (Economics, Geography and Mathematics) and Commerce (Accountancy Group) faculties of Under-Graduate Studies. The College has just completed the twenty year of its fruitful existence. While Honours teaching in Geography had already been introduced, w.e.f. the academic session 2001-2002, the same in Bengali was introduced w.e.f. the academic session 2002-2003, and Political Science (Honours) and History (Honours) were introduced in 2004-2005. and English (Honours) and Education (Honours) in 2005-2006 and Philosothy Hons in 2009. Plans are afoot to extend Honours teaching facilities in some other subjects in the coming academic sessions. Special mention may be made about the academic environment of this locality whithin the monority (Muslim) and Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribe Communities. Bereft of any opportunity to undertake higher education till the establishment of this College, a large body of Muslim students (at least 35% of the total intake) had a fight within and out to pave the way for social transformation, in venturing to take up this challenge in an area where an overwhelming majority of students from all sections have been engaged as the first generation entity in the domain of higher education.



The vision of the College is reflected through its 'Logo' that signifies the attainment of our stated goals whereby we aim at ensuring the spread of higher education with empowerment of students-male and female alike creating of an academic ambience, improvement in the quality of the teaching learning-evaluation process with special emphasis on backward students. With a view to achieving these objects, our students, teachers and the non-teaching staff participate in the community-related programmes, over and above the academic pursuits of the students.

We are proud to mention here a new feather has been added to the cap of this College in the form of national recognition when the 'National assessment & Accreditation Council (NAAC) has evaluated the progress of this College so far and awarded B Grade (70-75%) level of distincition to this young College. This proves that the path of progress chosen by this College, if sustained and advanced with care and affection, can win many more laurels for this Institution in future.

The college has set up an IQAC cell (Internal Quality Assessment Cell) according to the NAAC guidelines. This cell has sent the annual IQAC report for 2006-07 and the report has been acknowledged by the council.



### •Admission Procedure

Admission is made strictly on the basis of merit and reservations in various courses are made in keeping in with the Government rules. Applications for admission to Degree Courses have to be made on the prescribed forms that is to be had from the college office at the dates fixed for the purpose. Forms are issued on production of the original marksheet of the last qualifying public examination on the basis of which admission is made. In the next stage, the admission form is duly filled by and accompanied by necessary certificates and xerox copies of Marksheet etc. and these has to be submitted and prescribed fees have to be paid to the office fixed for the purpose. The following documents in original are to be presented at the time of admission.

- Marksheet and Certificate of the last qualifying public examination.
- Admit Card to the Madhyamik / H. S. or other equivalent examinations where date of birth is mentioned.
- Passport size Photo.
- Attested Copy of SC / ST Certidificate is to be produced at the time of admission.
- Migration certificate (in original) for a migrating student getting transfered from another College is to produce the original transfer certificate.

# Academic Session and Vacation / Recesses

The Academic Session is counted from July to June. The Vacation / Recesses are as follows:

Summer Recess: Normally from 16th May to 30th June.

Autumnal Vacation: Normally from Sasthi of Durga Puja to Bhatri Dwitiya.

Winter Recess: Normally from 25th to 1st January.

### Attendance of Students

A student once admitted must regularly attend classes. As per University regulation, a student must attend at least 75% of the total number of classes held in each subject group of any undertaken course during each session. As per this rule students stand classified as follows:

- 1. 75% and above-collegiate.
- Less than 75% to 60% of the classes -Non-Collegiate.
- Less than 60% of the Classes -Dis-Collegiate.

A dis-collegiate student will not be allowed to sit for College and University Exams. A Non-Collegiate student strictly will be allowed to sit for examination at the discretion of the authority.



### **Exam System**

The Annual College Test will be held tentatively for the following years: B. A. (Hons. and Gen.), B.Sc (Hons. & Gen.), B. Com (a)—Part-I- tentatively 2nd week of March 2012. B.A (Hons and Gen), B. Sc. (Hons and Gen), B. Com (G) Part-II—Tentatively 2nd week of Feb. 2012. B.A. (Hons and Gen), B. Sc. (Hons and Gen), B. Com (a)—2nd Week of Jan. 2012. Mid-term test for all years will be held in November. 2011.

### Coaching for Service Exams

We understand that education just limited to the syllabus of the college cannot prepare students to face the challenges of competitive exams. Thus the college has intention to start coaching for various service oriented exams like SSC, WBCS etc.

### **Remedial Coaching**

The College is poised to hold remedial coaching for SC/ST and minority students. The coaching is aimed to help these students to do fare better academically.



### Registration and Migration Certificate

Regular candidates are required to take initiative to obtain University Registration Certificate. Students who come from other Universities or Education Boards / Council are provisionally admitted on production of the migration certificate from such purticular University / Board / Council. After provisional admission, they need to apply through the Principal within one month from the date of admission to the Calcutta University with the requisite fees for Migration certificate to get his / her admission confirmed. The college will not be responsible if the university does not sanction migration to such candidates and in such cases provisional admission may be cancelled.

Registration forms are required to be filled up after admission. The college will not be responsible for the registration of those students who fail to comply with the university rules.

### Library and reading Room

The College Library along with reading room facility is at present accommodated with in an area of 1350 sq. It is not yet fully equipped with optimum collection of books, neverless the , continuous efforts are initiated to increase the number of titles as well as that of copies of titles (both Text books and reference books) as early as possible. Recently, a good number of copies had been added with the help of the UGC fund in the library. The library is in the process of being fully computerised. It is now partially computerised and most of the books are documented in the Computer.

The library sub-committee looks after the proper functioning of the library.

Borrowers are responsible for the books issued to them for home facility. In case of any damage or loss of any books issued to them, it will have to be replaced at his/her expense.

### **Sports Activities**

Elaborate arrangement exist for both indoor and outdoor games and sports. The institution, being a co-educational one, there are both Girls and Boys Common Rooms that are equipped with facilities of indoor Games.

The college team has faired well in football meets (Inter Non-Govt. College) as well as in various Atheletics Meets.

### Multigym-Cum-Fitness Centre

A fully equipped Multi-Gym has become functional within the premises of Bhangar Mahavidyalaya. The Centre is open to students of the College, members of the Alumni Association and also the youth from the locality can avail the facility all at a nominal fees.



### **Educational Excursion**

It is mandatory for students in Geography (Both Hons and General) to undertake educational tours for collection of relevant informations and taking first hand knowledge about mother nature. This provides for additional opportunities to acquire knowledge for their curricula apart from enabling them to familiarise themselves with the socio-economic and cultural life of the people of our mother land.

Though it is not mandatory, educational excursions have been held by various departments of the college for enriching the horizon of knowledge. In 2006, the History Department had visited the historical site, Chandra Ketughar and in 2008, the department visited Murshidabad.

The Department of Pol. Sc. made a short tour of the science city.

### Students' Union

The Students' Union, an elected body is an important segment of the College, committed to students' welfare and maintaining a healthy atmosphere in the college. Representatives from different years and office-bearers of the union are elected annually by the general body of the students through secret ballot. The activities of the Union include holding of Freshers' Welcome Annual Cultural Function, Debates, publication of magazine, sports etc.

The Students' Union is also closely associated with the administrative activities of the College and is run according to democratic norms. The Students'Union has its own constitution approved by the College Governing body.

### Alumni Association

The Alumni Association, formed in the year 2003, aims to participate and contribute to some social programmes undertaken by the College like organising various camps viz. Health, Blood Donation Camps etc. The Unit organised a film show to raise fund for Tsunami relief sometime ago.

### Teachers' Council

A Teachers' Council, constituted as per the statue of the Calcutta University consisting of all members of the teaching staff, assists the administration through active participation in various academic and administration functioning of the college.

### Netaji Subhas Open University

Keeping in mind the need of all round higher education of students living in Bhangar area, the Bhangar Mahavidyalaya has started a study centre of Netaji Open University in the college that provides undergraduate and post graduate courses in the following subjects. Bengali, History, Political Science, English, Mathematies, Education, Commerce, BLib., Masters in Social work. Co-ordinator of the study center is Dr. Nirupam Acharyya.

### Shiksha Karmi Union

Shiksha Karmi Union has been formed in 1999 in the college. Each and every member of the non-teaching staff is very keen in performing his/her respective duties and responsibilities towards this institution. This helps in the maintenance of a peaceful atmosphere through active participation and representation of all the segments (Students, teaching and teaching staff) of the college.

### **WBCUTA Primary Unit**

In 2001, a Primary Unit under West Bengal College and University Teaching Association (WBCUTA) has been opened up in the college with all teaching staff as its members.

### Canteen

A spacious Canteen has been opened for the benefit of students and staff of this college, where food, snacks, tea, coffee etc are made available at low rates.

### **Notice Board**

Students are urged to take great care in looking at the notice Board on coming to or on leaving the college. No excuse will be entertained if notices on the board are ignored.

### Discipline

It is mandatory to maintain strict discipline in the classes as also in the college premises. Students should not loiter or indulge in nosiy and disorderly conduct in the college corridors or playground. Students are required to appear at the examinations held by the college. Performances in the examinations and attendance in the classes are essential criteria for promotion to the higher classes.

Sincere endeavours are made by the College Authorities to mitigate all problems or difficulties of the students. The college offers an excellent opportunity and space to the students for personal contacts with the teachers for their academic help and guidance, a hallmark of the college.

Students must be in their classes when the bell rings at the beginning of each period and must take their seats. They must not enter or leave the class rooms without the permision of the concerned teacher.

College property, laboratory equipment, furniture, library books etc. must be treated a with due care. Students are not permitted to smoke in the college campus. Impersonation at roll call in an offence. The principal has authority to impose fines or other appropriated punishment and in extreme cases may suspend or expel an offender.

### Students' Support System

1. Grievance Redressal Cell: A Grievance Redressal Cell has been operating in the interest of the students which includes a body comprising of teaching and non-teaching staff. To address every inconsistency and demand put forward by the students a 'Complain Box' has been set up. The problems are minutely studied for redressal and solutions are sought for the benefit of students by the members of the Committee.

2. Students' Aid Fund: The college has always endeavoured to make its education service available to students coming from low income group families by giving generous concessions and monetary help to them in consideration of their merit and pecuniary conditions. The aid fund committee is entrusted with the task of selecting deserving candidates and disbursement of money under the direct authority of the Principal. Every student has to countribute an amount of Rs. 20/- each session to the Aid Fund.

### Concessions

The College does arrange for concessions for the students. Some of the available types of concessions are from:

- a) Project office cum District Welfare Officer, Dept. of Backward classes welfare, Govt. of West Bengal.
- b) Mohasin Fund Fixed Endowment.
- Labour Welfare Organisation, Govt. of India / Ministry of Labour, Kolkata
- d) Amra(An NGO)

Also the Teachers' Council and the Non-Teaching Staff Asociation arrange for a few partial or full concessions according to the circumstances for the needy students who can not be covered under the above mentioned concession schemes.

- 3. Career Guidance and Counselling Cell and Placement Cell: This cell of the college provides counselling to students and guides them and helps them in matters of choosing and providing information abount various careers. The students can meet the professor-in-charge during the specified day and time. In the academic session 2007-08, four organisations had contacted the college and students had benefited from the information provided. In 2008-09 2 organisations had contacted the college.
- 4. Women Harrassment Cell: This cell has been launched with the intention of helping the woman / the girl student to cope with her hurdles. This is primarily a counselling wing where the professor-incharge can be contacted on the specified day and time. The cell marks the Woman's Day.
- 5. Talent Forum: Recently, the Talent forum organised for the display of the many art and crafts of the students of the college and the neighbouring village. The forum has been formed to highlight the many talents of the students that they are encouraged to nurture.
