#### **REPORT**

A state level seminar on "Our earth many challenges of conservation" was organized by IQAC of Bhangar Mahavidyalay on 22<sup>nd</sup> April 2019. Resource person Dr. Manas Roy, Chitranjan Cancer Hospital has discussed in his valuable lecture that Contaminated water, soil, and air can harm or kill plants and animals, disrupt food chains, and lead to long-term environmental degradation. Pollution can also contribute to other threats, such as climate change and habitat loss, creating a complex web of challenges for conservation efforts. The current challenges in environmental conservation revolve around various issues such as climate change, habitat destruction, loss of biodiversity, pollution, and resource depletion. These challenges are often interconnected and can have far-reaching impacts on ecosystems, wildlife, and human communities.

Prof. Ashish Biswas, Dept. of Geography BhangarMahavidyalaya in his valuable lecture pointed out World Health Organization and UNICEF data which speaks that about 785 million people lack access to even a basic drinking water service and two billion people lack access to improved sanitation as simple as a pit latrine and three billion people lack a facility to wash their hands. As a result, nearly 829,000 people die every year from diarrheal diseases, and 297,000 of those deaths occur among children under the age of five.

India has only 4% of the world's fresh water resources despite a population of over 1.4 billion people. The crisis has especially worsened in the recent years due to climate change which results in delayed monsoons, consequently drying out reservoirs in several regions. Other factors attributed to the shortage of water in India are a lack of proper infrastructure and government oversight and unchecked water pollution.

### **Seminar Objectives**

- 1. To address and protect natural resources, forests, wildlife, plants, and biodiversity.
- 2. Special focus on the preservation of the generation of resources for the future.

- 1. Participants are introduced to know why the protection of environment is important for the preservation of our earth.
- 2. Topic discussed about the prevention and control degradation of land, water, vegetation and air.
- 3. Newer perspectives of the awareness discussed by the resources persons.
