Financial Literacy

Financial literacy refers to the ability to understand and apply different financial skills effectively, including personal financial management, budgeting, and saving. Financial literacy makes individuals become self-sufficient, so that financial stability can be accomplished.

Financial literacy also requires the experience of financial principles and concepts, such as financial planning, compound interest, [debt](#) management, efficient [investment](#) strategies, and money-time value. Financial illiteracy can lead to poor financial choices which can have negative effects on an individual's financial well-being.

The key steps to improve [financial literacy](#) include: - Learning the skills to create a budget - Ability to track expenses - Learning the strategies to pay off debt .

The Four Pillars of Financial Literacy

Financial literacy is having a basic grasp of money matters and its four fundamental pillars: debt, budgeting, saving, and investing.

1. Debt

Debt is money we spend that isn't ours. While debt is viewed negatively, for most people, it is necessary because only the extraordinarily wealthy can afford to pay for a house, car, or education with cash. The first lesson here, is to understand the difference between good debt and bad debt and to **avoid bad debt as far as possible**.

Good debt is considered money borrowed for things that are absolutely necessary for making a life.

Bad debt is considered borrowing money or using a credit card to pay for things we don't need, such as expensive clothes, hi-tech electronics, eating out at restaurants, going on holidays, etc.

2. Saving

Saving is an essential part of financial wellness, a secure present, and a happy future. Wealth is built through spending less of our income

Putting our savings into an interest-yielding bank account not only keeps our money safe, and out of temptation's reach, but also allows us to grow it over time.



. Budgeting

Budgeting is the life skill of planning and managing our money. By understanding exactly where our money goes every month, we are empowered to create an actionable plan by which we can spend less, by curtailing those unnecessary expenses and saving more for the things we need and want.

The rule here is that money coming in (total income) should always be greater than money going out (total expenses). The difference between the two values is savings.

Budgeting helps us plan for short, medium, and long-term expenses, enabling us to save accordingly to afford all three. It is, therefore, entirely necessary for financial security and independence.

4. Investing

Investing is all about creating and growing the wealth we need to enjoy a financially secure and happy future. It's about putting our money into something that will make a profit over time, such as property, retirement funds, and unit trusts.

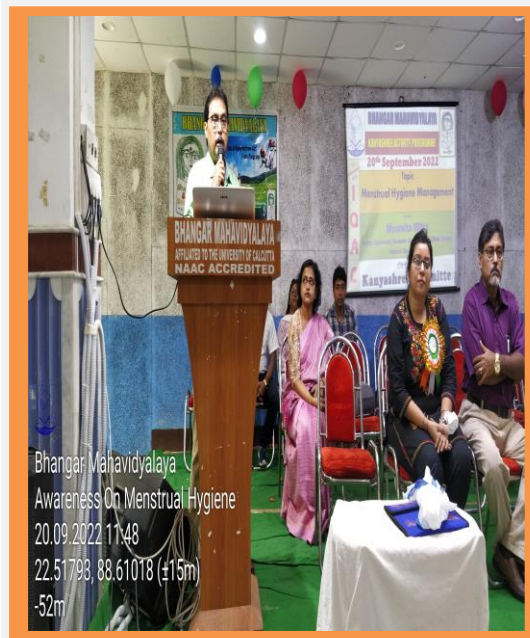

- Discussion on effective schemes for mangrove restoration

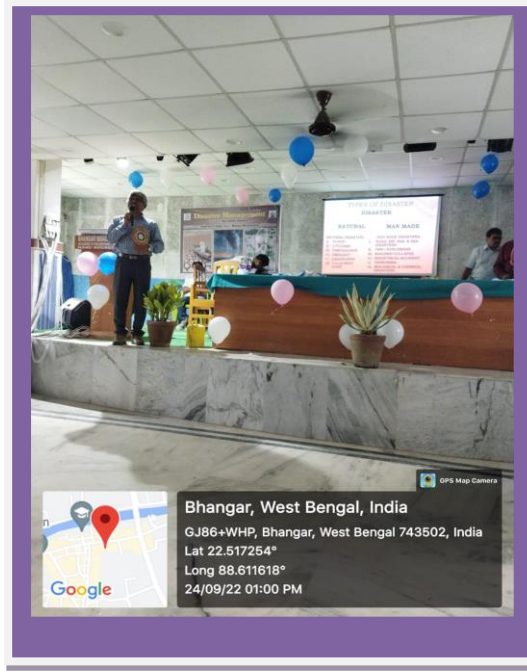

One Day State Level Seminar on Child Marriage

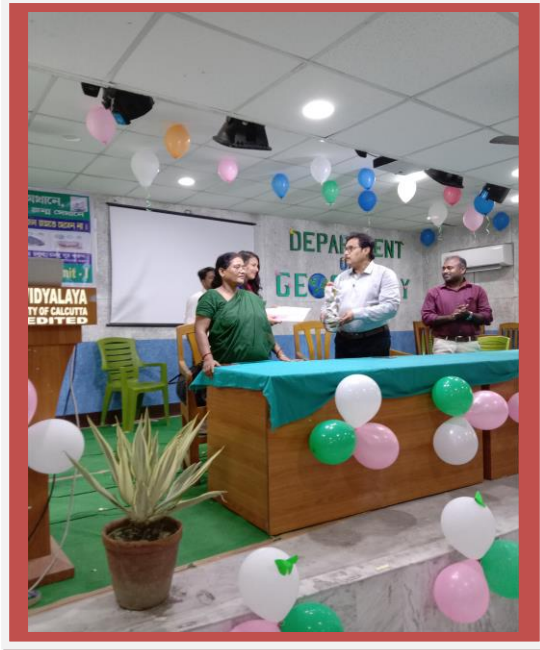
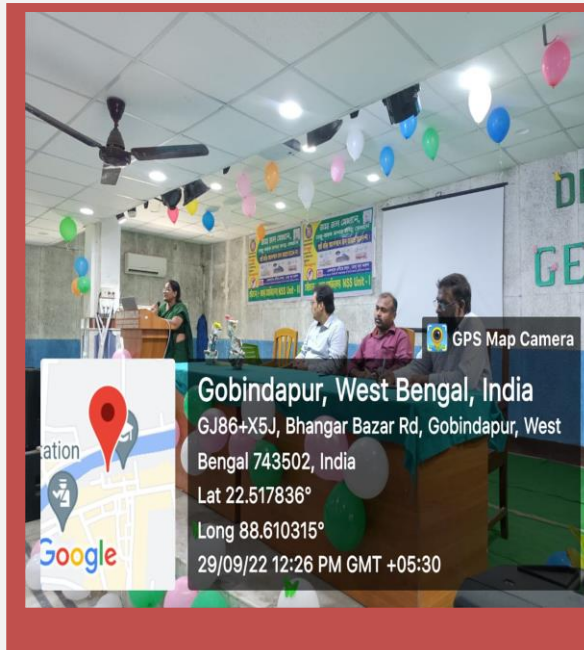
One Day State Level Seminar on “ Child Marriage “ was organized by IQAC of Bhangar Mahavidyalaya in which Child Marriage: Prof. Somnath Mandal, Associate Professor, Department of History has delivered a valuable lecture on 28/09/2022. In his lecture he discussed the child marriage aspects and its bad impacts that young women are subjected to. During Bengal Renaissance, Raja Rammohan, one of the foremost social reformers of the time, questioned the orthodox 19th Century Bengal that continued with the practice of Sati, disallowed women to inherit property and most significantly they were not allowed to be decision- makers in any aspect of their own lives.

The speaker pointed out that Child Marriage was a societal disease and a society that allowed such practices can never progress. Often poverty is pointed as one of the root causes of child marriage and this has to be prevented through social welfare programmes by promoting girls’ education and here the speaker noted the words of Gandhiji to Mridula Sarabhai: “I have brought the Indian women out of the kitchen; it is up to you (the women activities) to see that they don’t back to the kitchen.” It is a social practice that must be ruthless stopped and this social evil must be eradicated with a strong hand.

State Level Workshop on Dengue

A workshop on Dengue was organized by NSS Unit I & II of Bhangar Mahavidyalaya in seminar hall on 29/09/2022 when dengue cases were spreading in the area. It is worth-mentioning that every year people of the area suffered from dengue and both units actively engage their volunteers to aware the people how to save themselves from dengue. For this purpose, a resource person Mrs Sumati Das, Health Supervisor of Nalmorhi hospital has been requested to deliver a lecture on dengue when dengue was spreading in the area and there were several cases of dengue victims. Mrs Sumati Das has delivered a valuable lecture on vector disease by saying that vector disease spreads due to an infection transmitted to human and other animals by blood feeding antropods such as mosquitoes, ticks and fleas. He pointed out that water logging in anywhere whether it is in cooler, pots and other place inside or outside house help breed mosquito which at the end results dengue. Apart from this, both units carried out a rally inside and outside the campus especially in adopted villages same day. The rally rout was from the campus to Ghatakpukur, Police Station and Bhangar Bazaar and adopted villages. They also distributed leaflets concerning the spread of other disease like Chikungunya and other vector disease.

Workshop Objective:

1. To aware the volunteers and common people how to control spread of dengue
2. To address vector borne disease like dengue, malaria, west Nile virus etc.

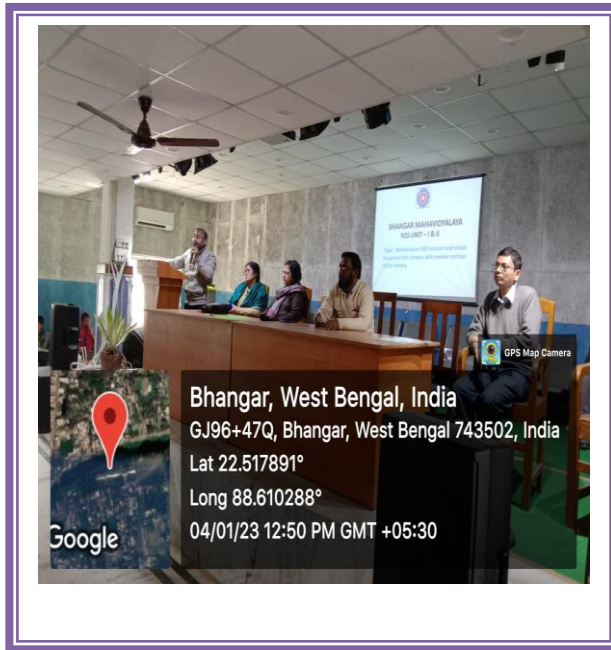
Workshop Outcome:



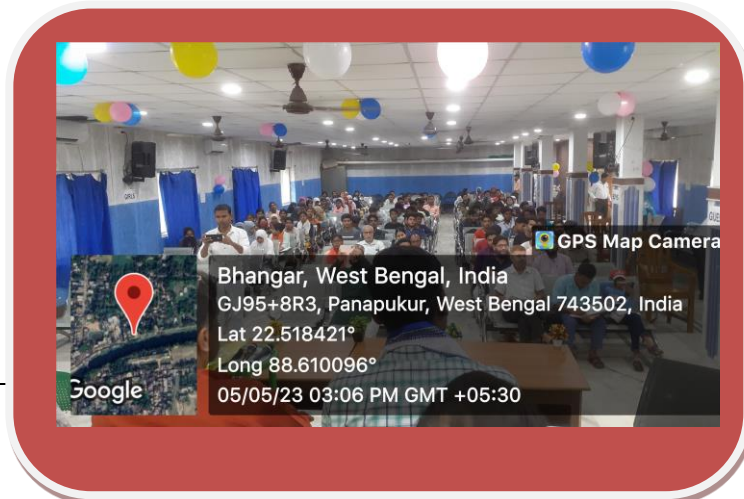
Report on State Level Seminar

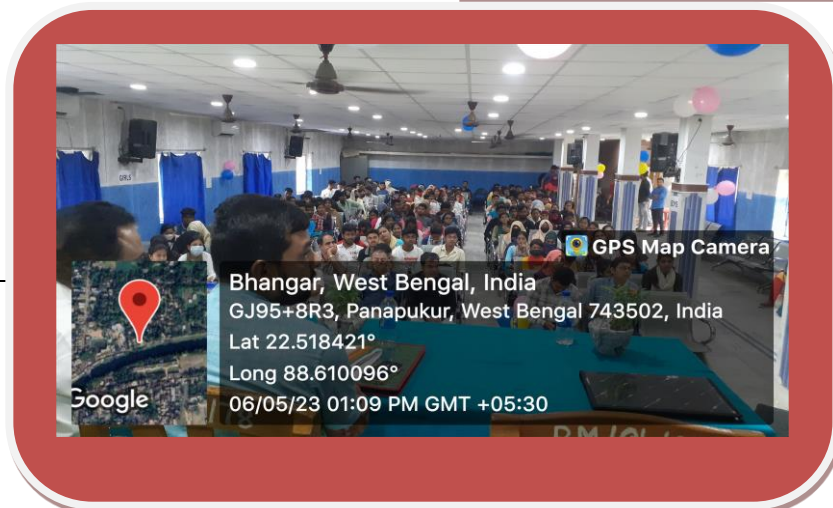

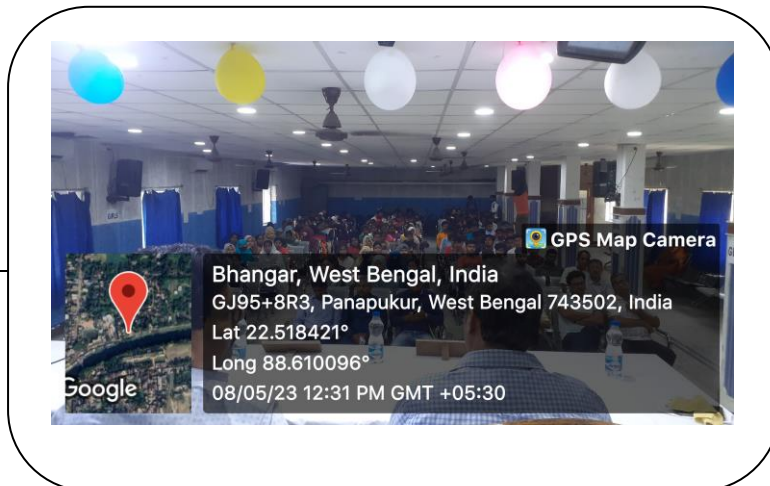
Another topic was 'Vedanta' which is the root of all our knowledge base, where we find the great saying Brahma satya, Jagat mithya - the Monism and the unification of all.

It provides them with the knowledge and skills they need to succeed in their chosen careers and helps to improve the economic and social conditions of their communities. The seminar on extension education for rural youth was held in our college, organized by the Dept. of Education and this report aims to summarize the key points discussed during the seminar.

The seminar was held on May 8th, 2023, at college auditorium. It was attended by a diverse group of participants, like expert from Jadavpur University, professor of all other depts. of our college, our present students, including alumni, and our college officials.
